Prevent Unconstitutional attacks in our Community

Our Government has declared a "war on terrorism". As part of this "war" at home, our friends, and neighbors, as well as religious institutions, small businesses, workers and social justice organizations may be subject to unfair and potentially harmful actions as part of "anti-terrorist" investigations, and crackdowns on free speech.

Collaborate to defend each other's rights...Following the FBI raids on Somali businesses in Rainier Valley, people joined together to raise money and support the owners and workers who were adversely affected by the raids. The Mutual Aid Pledge (MAP) takes community support for those subjected to such harassment a crucial step further, by signing the MAP, individuals as well as community, political, and religious groups will commit in advance to offer financial, political, or other appropriate types of support to each other as need arises. If we come together now, law enforcement and other public and private institutions will have to calculate the costs of heavy-handed or unfair treatment of people in our community. If we come together now, we will be ready to respond to these institutions if they act inappropriately or trample people's rights.
